The Irish Among Us, Part 2 The Catholic Church, the Irish, and the Ku Klux Klan

Sometimes when we look at decades past, we focus on the good. But within sight of the idyllic is the rest of the picture. The 1920s are a prime example, even in our small, quiet prairie town.

Decades earlier, several families who immigrated from County Waterford, Ireland came to settle in Tremont. Early on, several leaders of the Irish settlers formed a Catholic church which met in people's homes. In 1863, they purchased a vacant schoolhouse for their services. In 1875, there was an attempt to build a church, which was unsuccessful. Finally in 1879, a group of men organized a successful effort to build a Catholic church, which held its first worship services on Christmas Day of 1880. Many of the names of the those who were on the organizing committee are still familiar today. They were William Connell, John Cullinan, James Cooney, Patrick Ryan, Michael Morrisey, John Fitzgerald, and Nick Menard.

The Catholic Church, known by many as St. Patrick's Catholic church, had an organ, a coal or wood burning stove, and stained-glass windows. However, in the early 1900s, the church closed its doors due to a shrinking congregation. One likely reason is that, with cars becoming more popular, it was much easier to attend the larger Catholic church in Pekin. The church continued to stand until the 1930s, when it was torn down.

Fast forward to the 1920s and the next generation. Recall that the "Roaring 20s," were a time of gangs, flappers, bootleggers, and Prohibition. Not so well-known is that the early 20s also saw a revival of the Ku Klux Klan. The original KKK was an active and hate-filled group targeting African Americans in the post-Civil War South. The 1920s Ku Klux Klan could also be violent and bigoted, and was a social fraternity as well, favoring each other in businesses, etc. They supported national prohibition and despised big business and labor unions. They were also anti-Catholic and anti-Irish.

In interviews with some older members of our community, it is confirmed that Tremont did, indeed, have members of the KKK who targeted the businesses and homes of many of the Irish in town. Tales of fiery crosses on front lawns (of some houses that still stand today) and meetings in the countryside outside of town have been told. But there is little to be found in the newspapers of the day about these activities.

By the end of the 1920s, the KKK organization around the country collapsed.
