## TBA Disbursement Meeting - March 20, 6:00 pm

#### The Tremont Betterment Association Disbursement Meeting

Tremont Betterment Association is the managing body of the Tremont Turkey Festival. The members of the TBA board are past Turkey Festival General Chairmen. All of the profits of the Tremont Turkey Festival are funneled directly back into our community. One way this happens is at the TBA Disbursement Meeting, which is normally held the third Wednesday in March each year. Any group or individual in the Village of Tremont may submit a request for disbursement of funds. All requests will be subject to vote at the meeting.

*To Submit a Request:* If you would like to submit a request for disbursement, <u>download</u> <u>this form</u>, fill it out, and submit either through mail or email (addresses listed on the form).

- The 2024 request forms <u>must be</u> submitted by March 15, 2024.
- The meeting will be held at 6:00 on March 20, 2024 at the Community Center.

*At the Meeting*: A representative must be present at the meeting and be prepared with the following:

- Present a 2-3 minute presentation about your request. Items to highlight would be a bit about your organization, how it helps our community, and how many Tremont residents would benefit by your request.
- Answer questions (if any) from Betterment members.
- Representative will leave the meeting after his/her presentation.

After the presentations, the Tremont Betterment Association board members will vote on how the 2023 Tremont Turkey Festival funds will be disbursed.

Disbursements will be mailed out within a week of the meeting, and a notice of all disbursements will be in a Weekly Newsletter soon after the meeting.

### School Referendum Update - Final Update

Election day is Tuesday so this will be the last of these referendum updates. Thanks to everyone who has taken the time to read these articles. Hopefully, these updates have explained the information clearly so voters feel educated enough on the topic to know what they are voting for or against.

If you are reading about this for the first time or still need more clarity, the key points are explained below.

- There are two parts to the tax rate (1) the limiting rate, which generates revenue for educational programs and other operations and (2) the bond rate, which generates revenue to pay off the district's debt.
- The school district is seeking input from voters on a referendum that would add 0.40% to the current limiting tax rate for the school district. This would increase the district's limiting tax rate from 4.22% to 4.62% for taxes payable in 2025 (shown in chart below).
- The limiting rate increase would coincide with a projected 0.79% decrease in the bond tax rate (compared to the current year) as a significant portion of the district's debt from building bonds is paid off over a two-year period. The current year's 0.91% bond rate is projected to be only 0.12% by 2026.
- The projected figures in the chart below illustrate the significant decrease to the bond tax rate over the next three years and the corresponding decrease to the overall tax rate.

| 0.40% referendum | Current Year | Taxes payable 2024* | Taxes Payable 2025* | Taxes Payable 2026* |
|------------------|--------------|---------------------|---------------------|---------------------|
| Limiting Rate    | 4.22%        | 4.09%               | 4.62%               | 4.66%               |
| Bond Rate        | 0.91%        | 0.84%               | 0.24%               | 0.12%               |
| Overall Rate     | 5.13%        | 4.93%               | 4.86%               | 4.78%               |

- The overall tax rate will decrease even if the referendum passes because the bond rate is decreasing by more than the limiting rate would be increasing.
- IMPORTANT NOTE -- Language on the ballot will only address the increase to the limiting rate and not the decrease to the bond rate or the overall tax rate. Therefore, the ballot language will make it appear that there will be a tax increase. As explained above, however, *while the limiting rate will increase, the overall tax rate will decrease.*
- Despite cuts to staff and programs, years of state funding shortfalls created financial issues for the district over time, but the Board of Education was determined to reach this point before seeking a referendum to avoid increasing taxes on residents.
- Passage of the referendum would generate \$700,000 or more new dollars for the district annually and be used for maintaining and enhancing current programs, adding new programs for students, attracting and retaining staff, and upgrades to facilities, safety and security, and technology.

## Did you Know....?

#### Edward Cooney, Tremont Entrepreneur

The late 1800s in Tremont were exciting times, full of possibilities, risk-taking and spreading one's wings. Edward Cooney did just that. He was born in 1866, just east of Tremont, and later married Kathryn Loughlin, also of Tremont. Together, they had two sons, Edward A. and James.

Ed Cooney bought the building at 212 South Sampson in 1897 and opened a saloon together with a partner. Four years later, a February 1, 1901 Tremont News article stated, "Ed Cooney sold his saloon last week... to devote all his time to the livery business which he purchased recently."

By 1904, Cooney must have also seen a need for a pool room in Tremont. He bought two pool tables, one from Chicago, and opened a pool hall in the basement of the Columbia Opera House.

Also in 1904, an article appeared, mentioning that Ed Cooney had gone into a completely unrelated venture... the bridge business. As the years progressed, he received more and more contracts for area bridges, such as the 1910 Waltmire Bridge, now on the National Registry of Historic Places. He became well-known for his bridge work in several townships.

While still in the bridge business, Cooney entered into yet another business in 1905, when he opened a restaurant at 200 South Sampson Street. Also, in 1910, an article mentioned that Ed Cooney would be completing his contract with the village to lay new sidewalks.

In 1917, Cooney built the People's Garage, for Fred Trout (who owned and ran the Columbia Opera House) and Coulter (who owned and ran a grocery store with Baylor and then McGinnis in town.) This solid building still stands today. It is the larger building that makes up the Tremont District Library. Note the cement block exterior.

Besides sidewalks and local bridges, Cooney also left a lasting mark on Tremont in another way. He made the cement blocks for several homes he built in the Tremont area, including his own, which still stands today at 317 South Locust Street. Driving around Tremont, you'll spot several similar block homes. Some, if not all, were likely built by Cooney.

There were several other Tremont men who also felt free to explore many professions at the turn of the century, but probably no one was more diversified than Edward Cooney.
