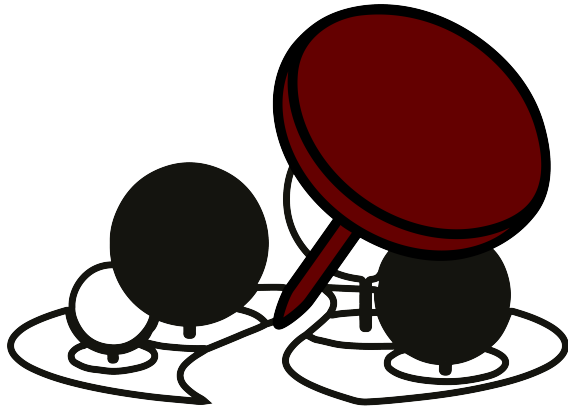

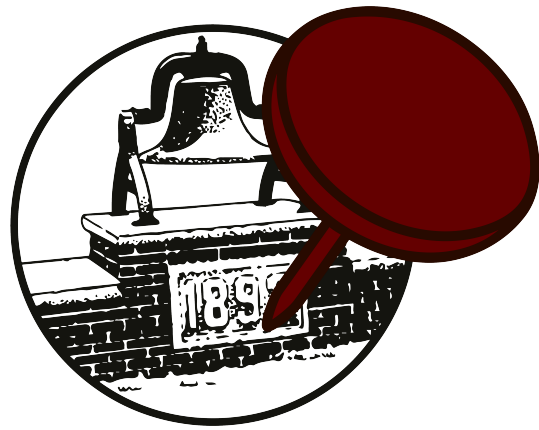

## Name has historical precedence, wears well

What's in a name?

When we selected *The Tremont News* as the name for this newspaper, we didn't make the choice lightly.

Frankly, we liked the alliterative quality of *The Times in Tremont*, and especially liked the way Bill Pflederer nicknamed it *TNT*.

There were some drawbacks

to that name, however, not the least of which was its similarity to the name of a somewhat larger newspaper to our west.

In casting about for a name, it wasn't too long before we remembered the old *Tremont News*, published in our town before the turn of the century and well into the twentieth century. We thought it might

be nice to turn the century again with a newspaper of the same name.

*The Tremont News* is a nice, functional name. It's not cute or clever, not gaudy or too bold. It promises to wear well.

Copies of the old *Tremont News* are available on microfiche for viewing at the Esther Washburn Public

Library with a viewer donated by Keystone Wire and Steel to the Tremont Museum and Historical Society.

We took the opportunity to look at some of the old issues and designed our front page flag to look very much like the old flag.

We've also included in this week's paper a short excerpt

from the earliest January edition available at the library.

Viewing the paper is not difficult and can be done by anyone. Doris Rapp and Judy Scheirer are so happy to see it used, they greet users with smiles and help.

Much of our inspiration for this publication is drawn from *The Tremont News*, Tremont's last printed newspaper. With your help, we hope to incorporate journalistic pieces, photography, and more into this reimagined version of the Tremont Newsletter. In researching the history of the Tremont News at the Tremont Museum & Historical Society, this article detailing the reasoning for its name was found. It turns out that *The Tremont News* has been a name resurrected more than once now, and as the article states, "it promises to wear well," into the future.
