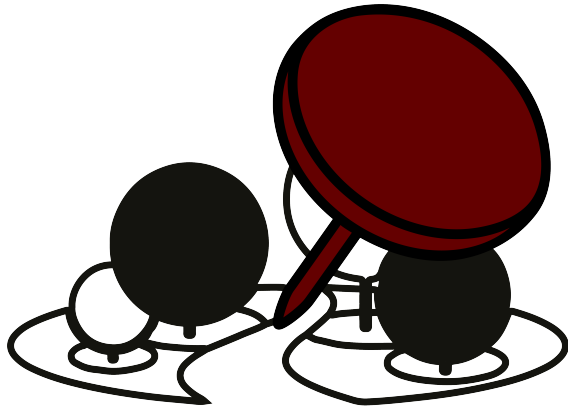

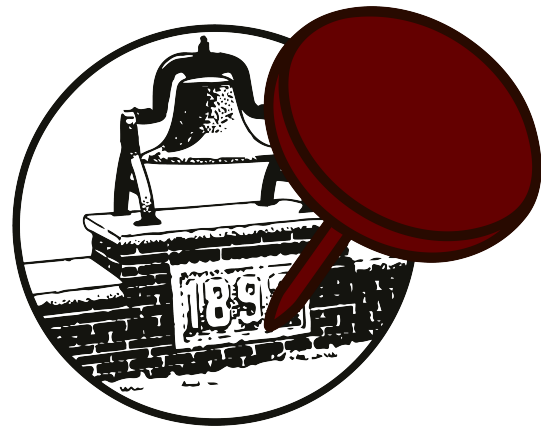

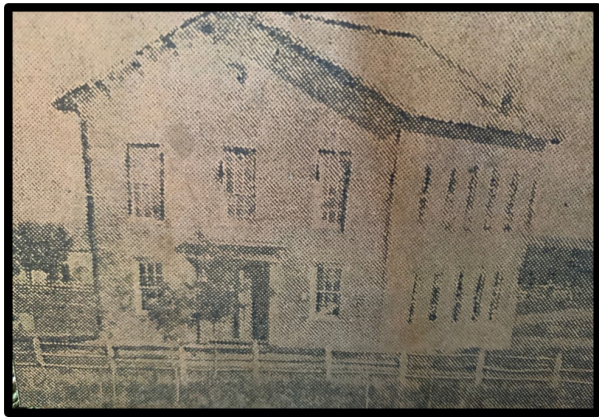

Did You Know? *Tremont, in History*

Tremont Female Seminary

The Female Seminary was supposed to stand in the center of the Tremont's public square, demonstrating the great value placed on education in Tremont, right from its beginnings. In today's context, the word seminary is used to mean a college that prepares students to be ministers, priests, or rabbis, according to dictionary.com. However, in 1850 when the Tremont Seminary was established, the word had a much different meaning. In the 1800s and early 1900s, education for women was not very common. A Female Seminary was a private educational institution.



Almarine Hayward was hired to construct a 44 X 28 foot two-story building in the public square (today's City Park.) However, many citizens of Tremont objected to that location for a private school. That was the first of the issues the fledgling school encountered. Very shortly, some stockholders were not paying their assessments; the budget had to be cut from the beginning.

Another location was found at the southwest corner of Park and Locust Streets, where the large grain storage bins stood until recently. The seminary opened on November 17, 1851 with 27 students, though the building was not quite finished. The school year consisted of three 14-week terms. The pupils came from all over the country. Early historians say it was one of the finest institutions of its kind in all of Illinois.

The Tremont Museum has an interesting display of Tremont Schools.

Have you ever wondered about the Native Americans who last lived in our area? Come to our next program, "The Unconquerable: The Kickapoo in Central Illinois." Bill

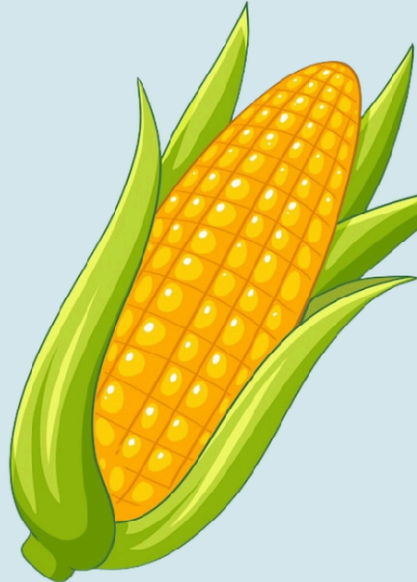
Historical Society September Program
