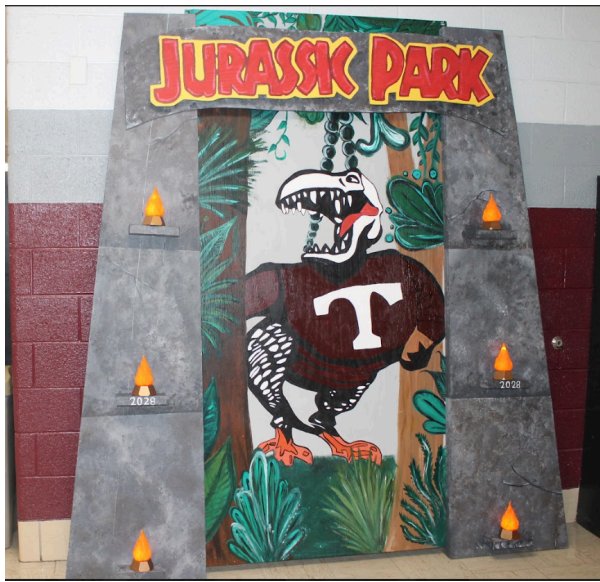

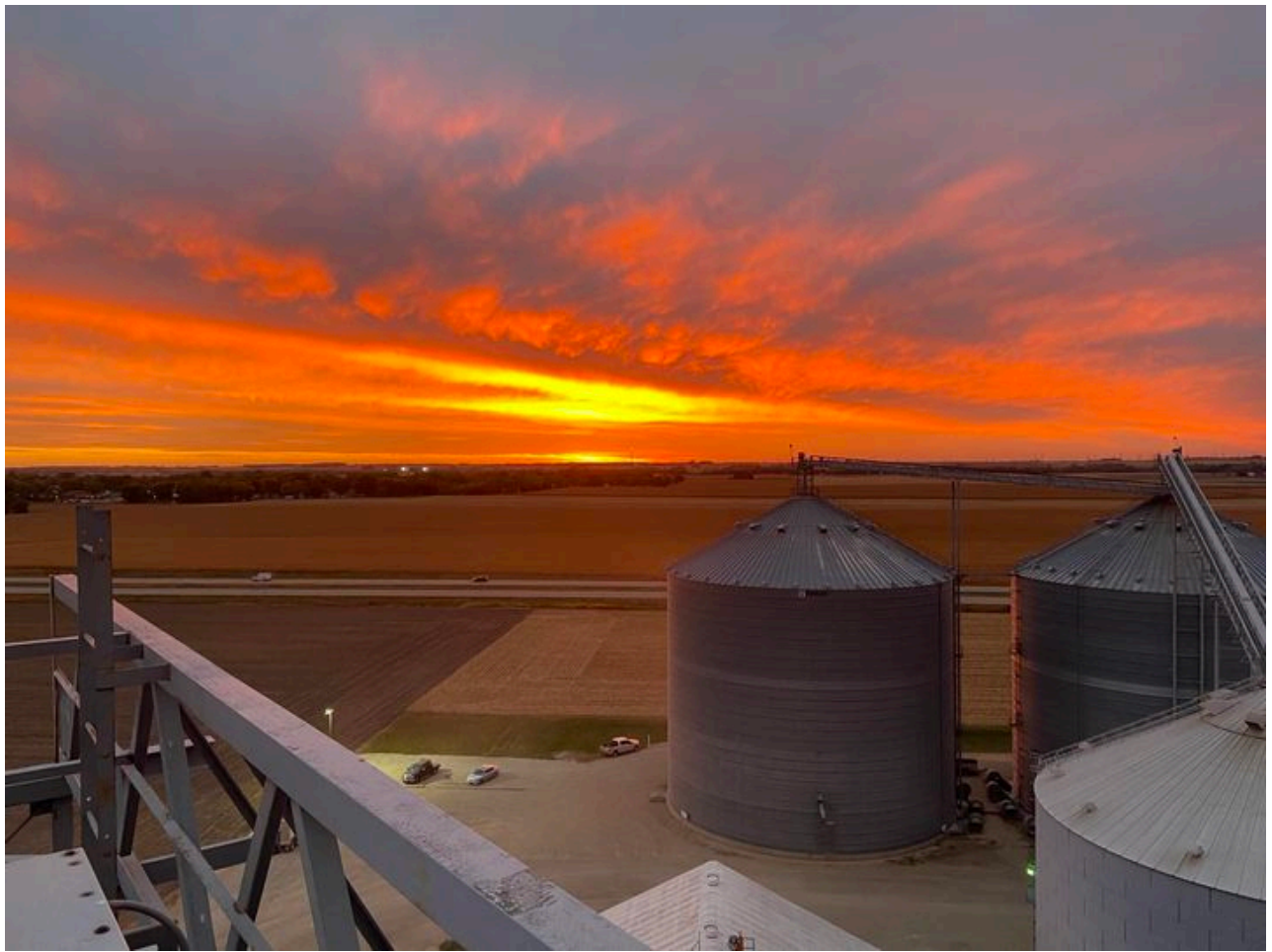

Start seeing farmers! Farmers in our area have been working tirelessly over the past few weeks to get their harvests in, and keeping them safe is key. [This article](#) from the Illinois Farm Bureau gives lots of info for rural road safety, but a few key tips are:

- Above all, slow down and be patient.
- Reduce speed when encountering farm equipment on public roads. Flashing amber lights mean “caution.”
- Keep a safe distance from the farm equipment so farmers can see you. If you can’t see their mirrors, they can’t see you.
