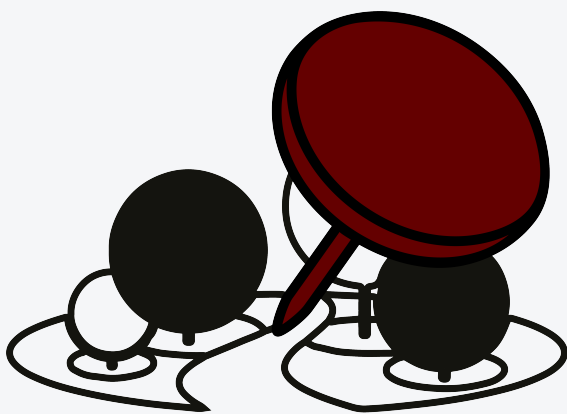

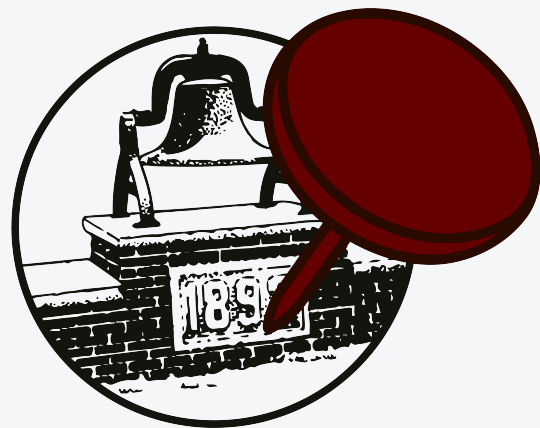

A Fire, A New Gym

Tremont was proud of the new gym, a wooden structure built behind Tremont Community High School (which faced Harris Street, about where the grade school playground is today.) It was built in 1923 and used for all number of school and community events. But just 10 years later, on a spring morning in 1933, an unexplained fire followed by an explosion left terrible damage. The building was insured, but not the contents. An old newspaper article lists some of the losses: the gym piano, Duane Cullinan's saxophone, stage curtains worth \$240, and damage to suits and other equipment of the basketball team. The fire chief, E.L. Riley, and assistant chief, William Bolliger, and other firefighters used water and chemical streams to fight the fire. While helping , George Gerstner slipped and fell off the south porch, crushing his knee very badly.

And the "new" gym was ruined.



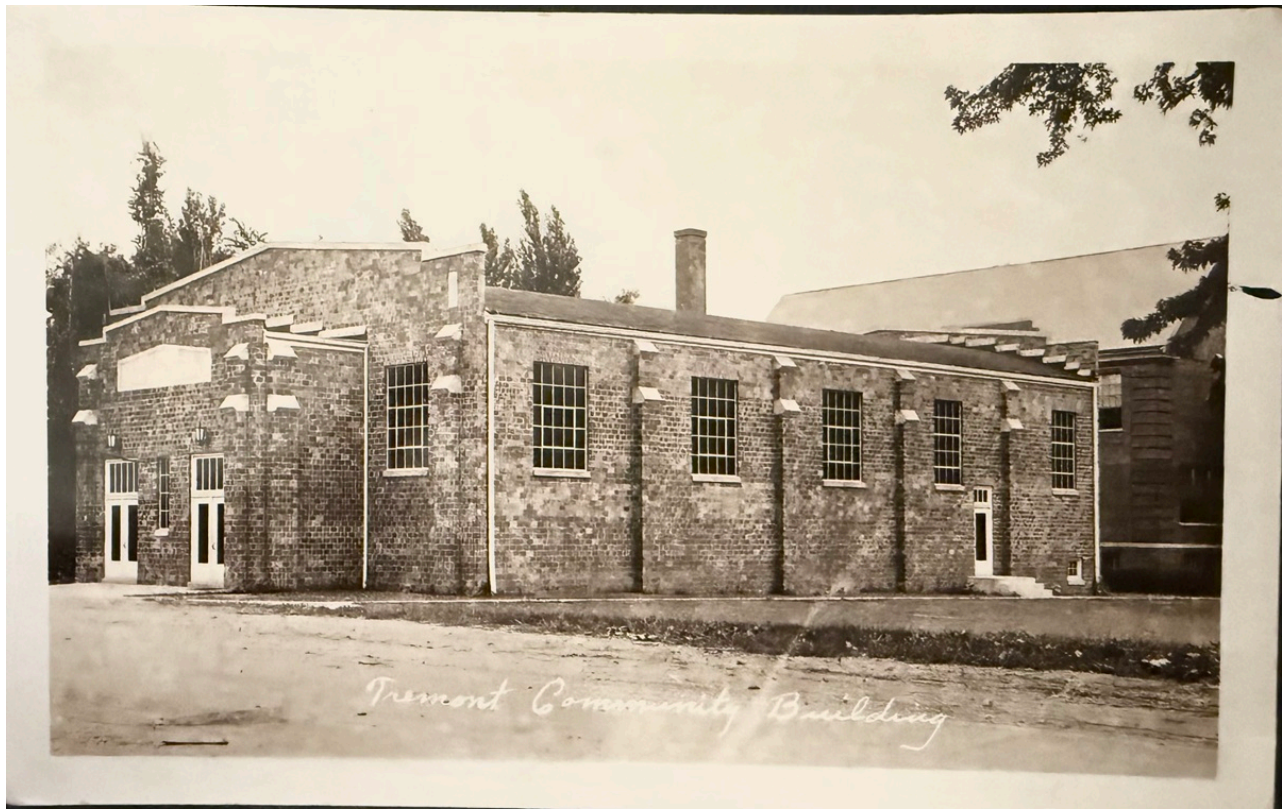
3rd and 4th grade boys standing in front of the gym that later burned down. Picture taken by teacher Esther Staker.

That same year, work began on a new structure to be called the Tremont Community Building, paid for by the village. The building faced James Street, behind the high school. It was said to be one of the most modern of its kind. Another old article states, "The building is of fancy brick and the design and equipment are fully modern. The structure has a complete gymnasium, a stage and a large auditorium for community gatherings." It was large enough to accommodate about one thousand people.

Over the following summer, a new ceiling was installed to help with acoustics.

Fast forward through time, and when the old high school was torn down and a new grade school was built facing James Street, the gym was reconfigured to be part of Tremont Elementary School, even today.

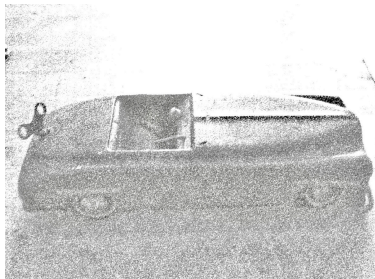

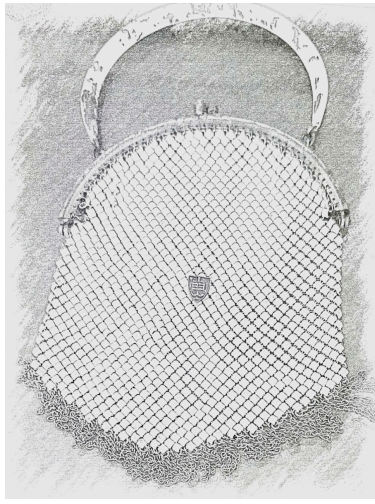
Tremont Museum's Vintage Collections Exhibit
