






Village of Tremont

Did You Know? *Tremont, in History*

Turn of the Century: Women's Cycling

A curious article in an 1887 copy of the Tremont News caught my eye:

"There is a growing craze among women at present to win and wear "century" run medals. And some of them even aspire to double and triple century honors. Nothing can be worse for them than these century runs. And as far as the greater distance contests, they are simply invitations to suicide - and overtaxing of physical strength that no women can long withstand."

What was a "century" medal? And why was it considered dangerous to women?

I found that the invention of the "safety" bicycle in the late 19th century ignited a huge bicycling boom. This bicycle version was much easier to get on, and women, with their long skirts, were even able to ride. This allowed women to become more independent, able to get out of the home for necessity and freedom. Susan B. Anthony claimed that the bicycle had, "done more to emancipate women than anything else in the world." Prior to this time, bicycles were designed for men only.

Cycling also brought about a new trend in fashion, called the “Rational Clothing” movement. Women soon took to the new fashions that no longer included bulky undergarments and long skirts. Fashions such as divided skirts and short skirts with bloomers became the rage for cyclists.

Soon, local “century” events were held for women to compete in long distance rides. Winners were awarded “century medals.” While these racing events were a new opportunity for athletic women, they were looked down on in general, as it wasn’t “seemly” for women, and in fact, likely unhealthy for their gentle constitutions.

While men’s cycling was part of the 1896 Olympics, it wasn’t until 1984 that women’s cycling was admitted to the Olympics. Women proved their athleticism beyond a doubt, showing that cycling was not “an overtaxing of physical strength that no woman can long withstand”!
