No school for so long makes it bad for both teachers and pupils but under all conditions the health is concerned.

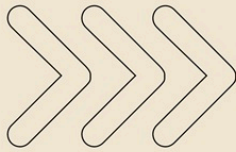

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

- *Your child must be five (5) by September 1, 2026 to attend Kindergarten in the fall.
- *Kindergarten Screening will be April 8th-10th. Appointments can be made at registration.
- *Please bring to Tremont Grade School for registration a copy of a certified birth certificate (not the one from the hospital) and proof of residency. (if you already have other children enrolled in Tremont District, you do not need to provide proof of residency again) We will make a copy and give you back your original. Proof of residency is required before entering school.

Please provide ONE of the following:

- *Most recent property tax bill and proof of payment
- *Mortgage paperwork indicating the property of residence
- *Signed and dated lease or rental agreement and proof of last month's payment or deposit (check or receipts)
- *Letter of residence signed and dated by a landlord in lieu of lease agreement

Please provide TWO of the following:

- *Driver's license
- *Vehicle registration
- *Voter registration card
- *Most recent credit card bill (gas, electric, water, cable TV)
- *Current public aid card
- *Current homeowners/renters insurance policy

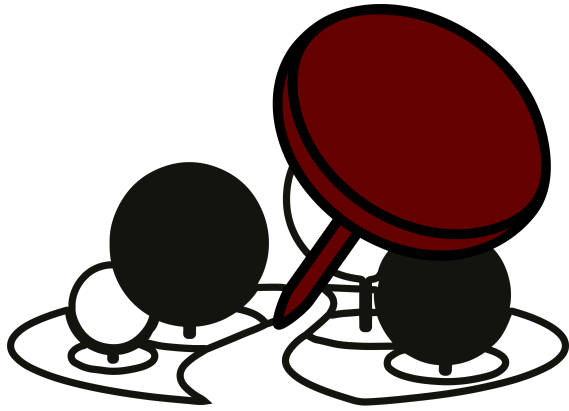

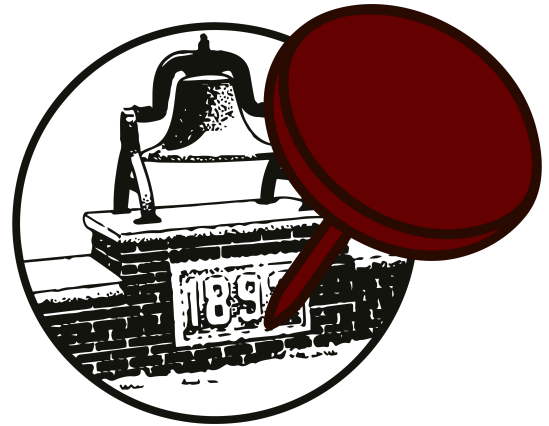

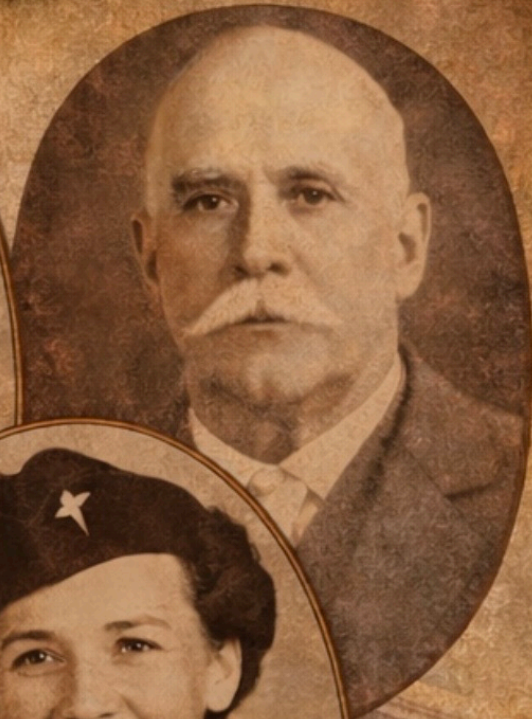
