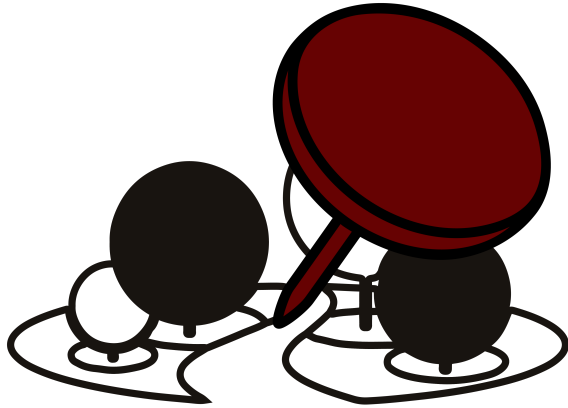

Did You Know? *Tremont, in History*

America 250: Fourth of July 1913

For several years, many Tremont residents made their desire known for some kind of town-wide celebration. Finally, a committee met and decided to hold a major celebration for the 4th of July.

An article in the June 18, 1913 issue of The Tremont News reported, "The grass will be mown and the Public Square put in fine shape for the ...celebration. The trees have grown in the past few years so that there is plenty of shade now." The village board even had a hydrant placed at the northwest corner of the Public Square as a convenience for the event.

Pre-event publicity announced, "Tremont will celebrate the 4th of July in the old-fashioned style, even to the red lemonade. We are going to have a monster parade, speaking, racing contests, ball games, and all will wind up in the evening with a monster display of fireworks and a band concert. There will also be a grand ball at night in the Opera House. Tremont does not often celebrate the Fourth, but when they do they always give the people the worth of their money." Later articles boasted the securing of the Elgin Band, the P.&O. Quartet of Canton, and Judge Russell. Still another article advised, "Come and bring your wife or sweetheart, and if they won't come, bring somebody else's wife or sweetheart."



The event was a huge success. According to the July 11, 1913 Tremont News, "Tremont's Fourth of July celebration was a success in every way...It was the best celebration Tremont has ever had..." The article went on to describe the ball games, the decorated automobile contest, and the "extra good" fireworks display. The dance at the Opera House was one of the most successful in a long time, the News reported, with over fifty couples crowding the

floors at all times. The dance continued until nearly 2:00 a.m...

Now, 113 years later, our country is celebrating America 250, a year-long recognition of our great country, our history, and our freedoms..

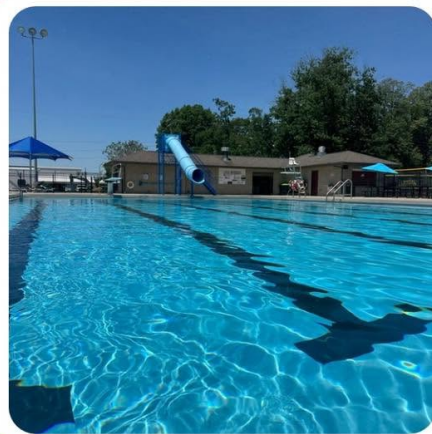
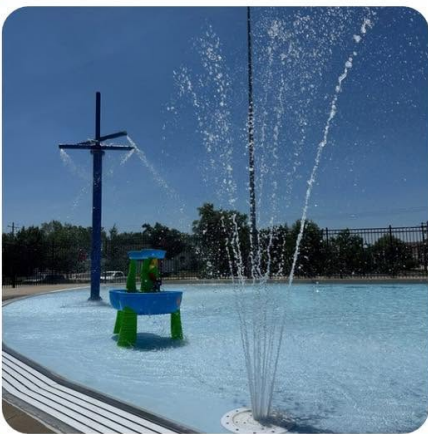
